

If it is food, you can compost it.



- Meat & bones
- Milk, cheese & other dairy
- Fruits, vegetables & peels
- Soups & sauces
- Dressings & condiments
- Flour, bread & pastas
- Nuts and shells
- Oils & fats
- Eggs & egg shells
- Spices
- Seafood and shells

These items cannot be composted:



- PLU stickers
- Milk & orange juice cartons
- Compostable bags, utensils, and cups
- Store bought floral products

To help you keep your food scraps out of the trash, we collect compost at these transfer stations:

Albany/Irasburg, Barnet, Concord, Corinth, Derby, East Haven, Glover, Greensboro, Jay/Troy, Lunenburg, Lyndon, Morgan, Newark, Newport Center, Norton, Peacham, Ryegate/Groton, Sheffield/Wheelock, Stannard (@Black Dirt Farm), Westfield, Westmore

**VT's Universal Recycling and Composting law
(Act 148)**

states that all mandated recyclables must be kept out of the trash.

MANDATED RECYCLABLES:

PLASTICS #1, #2

GLASS

ALUMINUM and STEEL

PAPER and CARDBOARD

Starting July 01, 2020, food scraps must be kept out of the trash.

FAQs:

Q: Why do we have to separate recycling in the NEKWMD?

A: All recyclables from District towns are handled in Lyndonville; separating recyclables allows us to efficiently process materials to sell to the market.

Q: Does the law require that I have to compost in my own backyard?

A: Not at all! We provide food scrap collection at many of our transfer stations. Check out nekwmd.org/organics.html for more info.

Q: What do I do with materials that the recycling center does not accept?

A: We accept all recyclables mandated by the law (plus much more!), therefore if we do not accept the item, it can be thrown into the trash.
