ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SPEED OF MOTOR VEHICLES ON CERTAIN TOWN HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE TOWN OF WESTFIELD

Pursuant to the provisions of Title 24, §§1971 and 2291, and Title 23, § 1007 of the Vermont Statutes Annotated, the Select Board for the Town of Westfield, Vermont, for the purpose of promoting the public health, safety, welfare and convenience, does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. GENERAL PURPOSE AND PREAMBLE

A. The Select Board for the Town of Westfield, Vermont, after having considered the neighborhood character, abutting land uses, bicycle and pedestrian uses, and physical characteristics of the streets and highways, and in accordance with a traffic study, has determined that requiring motor vehicles to travel on the following town highways within the Town of Westfield at speeds not exceeding thirty five (35) miles per hour will promote the safety of the motoring public and the public in general:

Town Highway #1, also known as North Hill;
Town Highway #3, also known as Kennison Road;
Town Highway #4, also known as Loop Road;
Town Highway #5, also known as Reservoir Road;
Town Highway #6, also known as Kingdom Mountain Road;
Town Highway #9, also known as School Street;
Town Highway #10, also known as Ball Ground Road;
Town Highway #14, also known as Kettle Farm Road;
Town Highway #15, also known as Cemetery Road;
Town Highway #17, also known as Balance Rock Road;
Town Highway #18, also known as Taft Brook Road;
Town Highway # 12 , also known as Lane Road;
Town Highway # 7, also known as Bessett Road;
Town Highway # 20, also known as Fuller Road;

Town Highway #19, also known as Buck Hill;
Town Highway #19a, also known as Trumpass Road;
Town Highway #24, also known as Monteith Road; and
Town Highway #26, also known as Buck Hill Road.

B. The purpose of this ordinance is to promote the public health, safety, welfare and convenience of the citizens of the Town of Westfield by requiring that motor vehicles travel at speeds not exceeding thirty five (35) miles per hour on the above enumerated town highways within the Town of Westfield.

WESTFIELD

SECTION 2. SPEED LIMIT ON ALL UNPAVED COVENTRY TOWN HIGHWAYS

The speed limit for any motor vehicles traveling on any portion of the following enumerated town highways shall be not more than thirty five (35) miles per hour:


Town Highway #1, also known as North Hill;
Town Highway #3, also known as Kennison Road;
Town Highway #4, also known as Loop Road;
Town Highway #5, also known as Reservoir Road;
Town Highway #6, also known as Kingdom Mountain Road;
Town Highway #9, also known as School Street;
Town Highway #10, also known as Ball Ground Road;
Town Highway #14, also known as Kettle Farm Road;
Town Highway #15, also known as Cemetery Road;
Town Highway #17, also known as Balance Rock Road;
Town Highway #18, also known as Taft Brook Road;
Town Highway #19, also known as Buck Hill;
Town Highway #19a, also known as Trumpass Road;
Town Highway #24, also known as Monteith Road; and
Town Highway, # 20, also known as Fuller Road

SECTION 3. PENALTIES

A violation of a provision of this Ordinance shall constitute a civil offense and be deemed to constitute a traffic violation in

accordance with the provisions of 23 V.S.A. §2302, and the penalty for such violation, and the waiver fee, shall be in such amount as established pursuant to the provisions of 23 V.S.A. §2302.

Select Board, Town of Westfield

The above ordinance was adopted by the Select Board of the Town of Westfield on June 13, 2011, and shall become effective, pursuant to the provisions of 24 V.S.A., § 1971, et seq, sixty days from the date of its adoption, to wit, on August 12, 2011, unless a petition for a vote on the question of disapproving the same shall be filed in accordance with the provisions of Section 1973(b) of Title 24, Vermont Statutes Annotated, which section provides that a petition for a vote on the question of disapproving an ordinance or rule shall be signed by not less than five percent (5%) of the qualified voters of the municipality, and presented to the legislative body or the clerk of the municipality within forty five (45) days following the date of adoption of the ordinance or rule by the legislative body.
