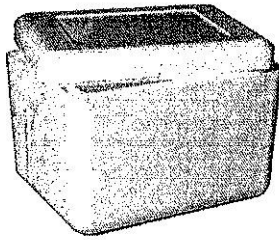


Styrofoam/EPP Recycling 101

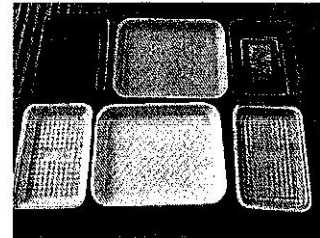
Expanded polystyrene (a.k.a. Styrofoam) is toxic — for our food, our environment, and our bodies. Most Styrofoam ends up in landfills, where it takes up a LOT of space and releases methane, a greenhouse gas. The good news is that Styrofoam/EPS can be recycled as long as they're **CLEAN, DRY, ADHESIVE LABELS/TAPE REMOVED, AND NO FOREIGN OBJECTS ATTACHED/EMBEDDED INTO THE FOAM ARE ATTACHED** —but only at a specialized facility.



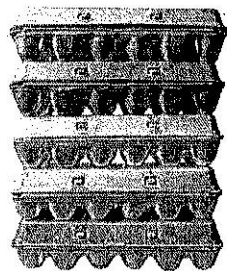

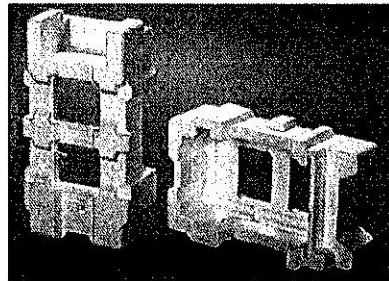
